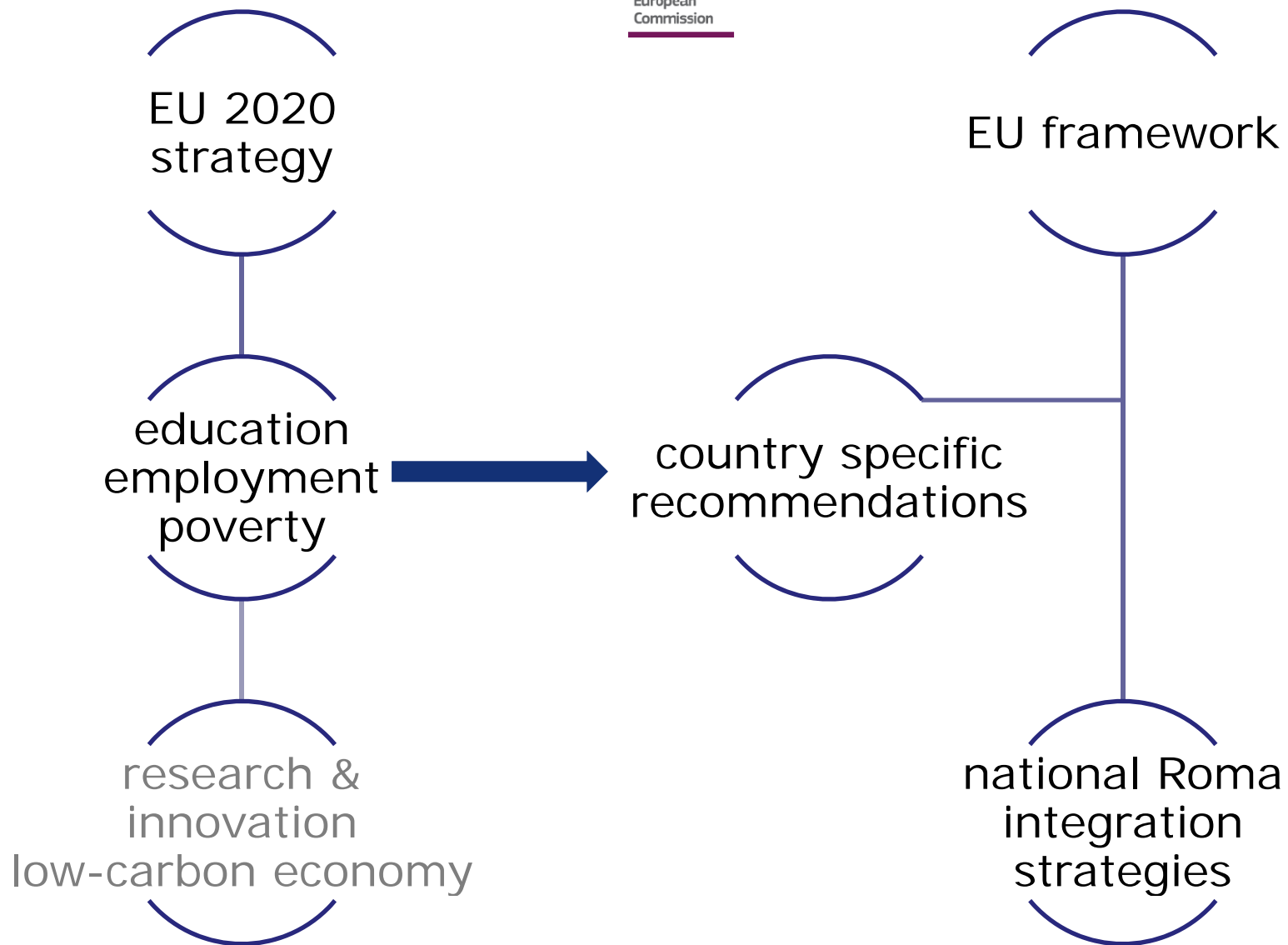
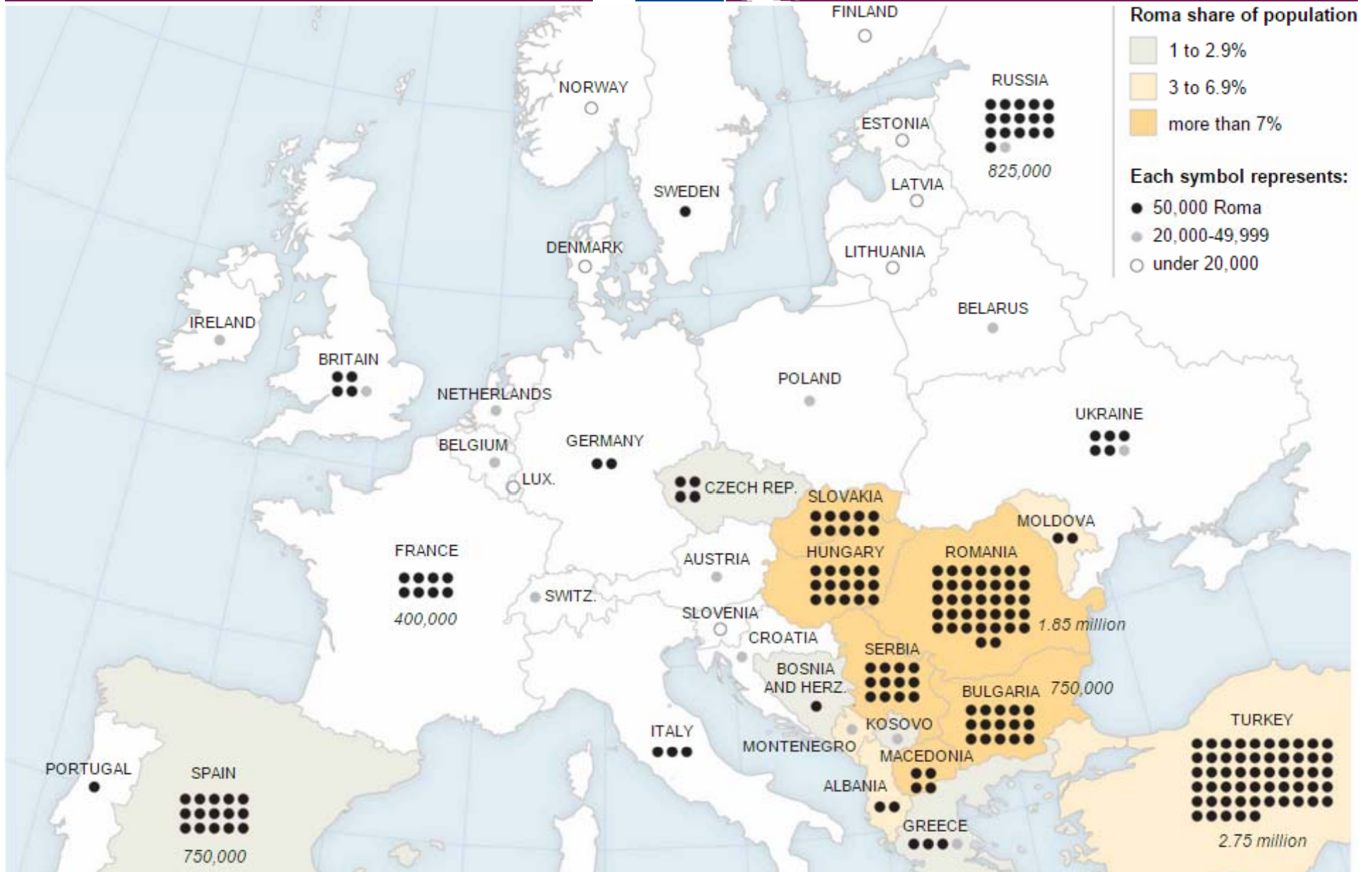




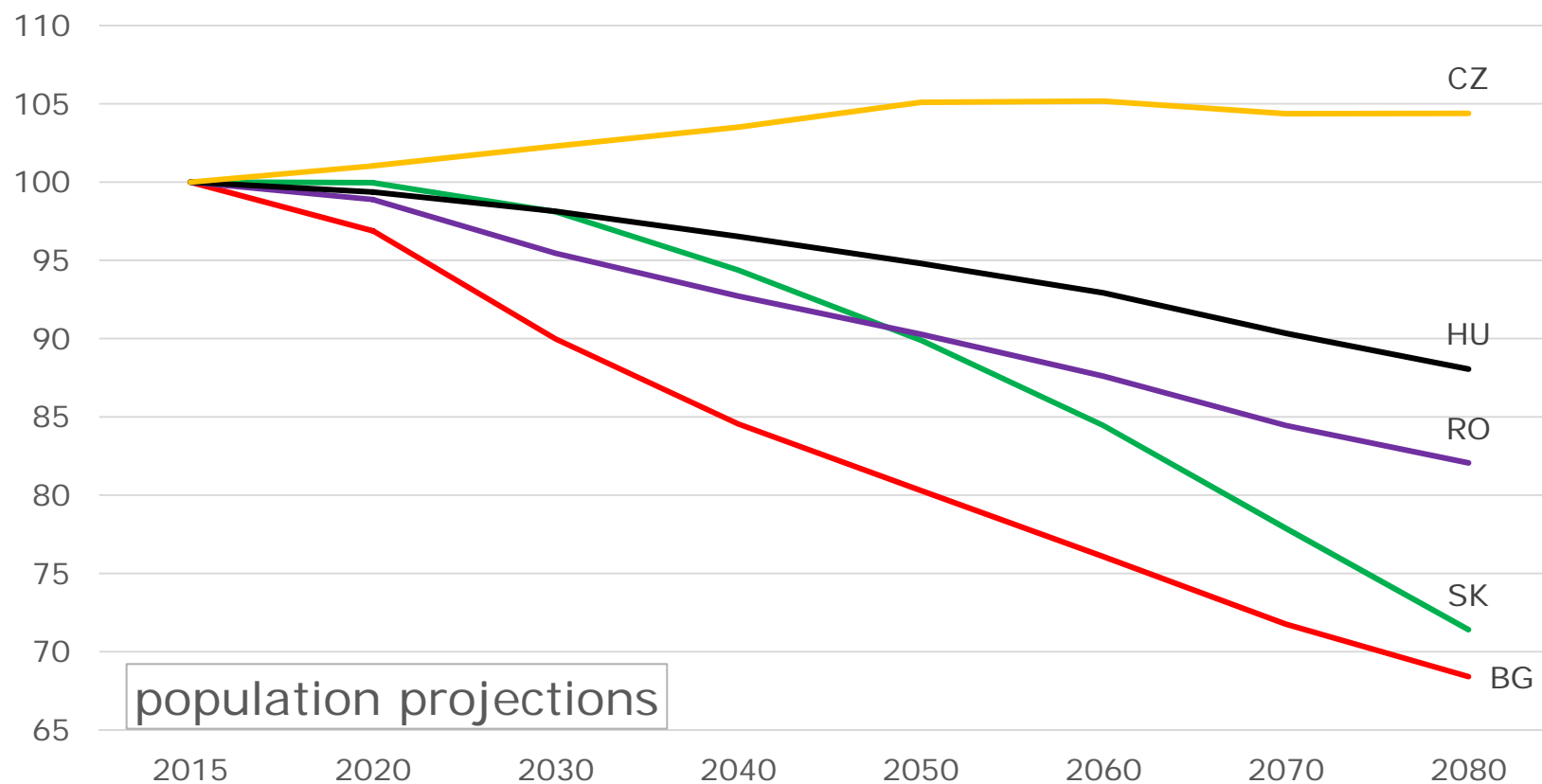

BG		increase the participation in education of disadvantaged children, in particular Roma, by improving access to good-quality early schooling
CZ		take measures to increase participation among disadvantaged children, including Roma
HU		increase the participation of disadvantaged groups in particular Roma in inclusive mainstream education, and improve the support offered to these groups through targeted teacher training
RO		increase the provision and quality of early childhood education and care, in particular for Roma
SK		increase the participation of Roma children in mainstream education and in high-quality early childhood education
