The 'OPEN DAYS – European Week of Regions and Cities' is the landmark event on EU Regional Policy. Over four days, some 6 000 participants – local, regional, national and European decision-makers and experts – gather each October to debate, exchange know-how and network. In addition to the Brussels-based workshops, over 300 local events run from September to November all over Europe.

In October 2013, regions and cities will be finalising preparations for the 2014-2020 cohesion policy, rural development and

fisheries programmes, marking the new timeline for the Europe 2020 strategy. With the slogan **'Europe's regions and cities taking off for 2020'**, the 11th European Week of Regions and Cities provides the opportunity for EU institutions, managing authorities and final beneficiaries to influence future developments by:

- exchanging views on new approaches even before the new operational programmes are implemented;
- capitalising on the results of 2007-2013 EU-funded programmes and projects.

The workshops will take place in Brussels' EU quarter: European Commission venues, at the Committee of the Regions ('Meeting Place'), and the venues of the OPEN DAYS 2013 partner regions and cities.

Highlights in 2013

The Meeting Place: Workshops and networking

Located in the Committee of the Regions' building, the Meeting Place will host **34 workshops**, often followed by **networking events**. Under the umbrella of 'EUrban and regional solutions: Investments, participation, networking', the workshops will focus on:

- 1. public investment and public-private partnerships;
- 2. citizens' participation and the involvement of civil society actors;
- 3. networking across borders.

The Meeting Place is the OPEN DAYS **networking hub**. It features a café, VIP rooms, the OPEN DAYS Media Centre and TV studio, and an area for larger receptions. It is the place to make contacts and exchange information and ideas.

OPEN DAYS University

The OPEN DAYS University consists of a series of lectures and panel debates, involving the Regional Studies Association and renowned academics and researchers in EU cohesion policy and related issues. University workshops will fall under the "Challenges and solutions" theme of the OPEN DAYS.

New this year is a **Master Class** for 71 selected PhD students and early career researchers in the field of regional and urban policy.

RegioStars Awards 2014

Participants will be able to find out about the **most innovative projects** which have received cohesion policy funding. A full day workshop will be organised to present the finalist projects of the RegioStars Awards 2014.

"Europe in my region" photo competition

OPEN DAYS participants are welcome to the small award ceremony for the "Europe in my region" - a photo competition showcasing how EU regional funding is being used and celebrating projects that are making a difference to local communities. The competition will be opened on Facebook during the summer 2013.

Local events

In an effort to bring the OPEN DAYS event closer to local and regional stakeholders, each participating region and city will organise one event locally between September and November 2013. Additional local events will be organised by other administrations, institutions or organisations and as part of European Cooperation Day on 21 September 2013.




'100 EUrban solutions'
